This course introduces the student to the many resources available on the Internet. Students will use the Internet and World Wide Web resources to communicate, collaborate and retrieve information. The course will also cover simple web page development using a variety of web editing tools.

2. Identify positive social and ethical behaviors when using technology and the consequences of misuse.
3. Plan, design and publish a Web site.
