INSTRUCTIONS: - Read the statements below and perform the tasks.

- 1. Create a HTML document, save as: loops.html
- 2. Use "For Loops" as content of the title element.
- 3. After each For Loop Exercise, insert a line break (see examples of syntax below).

```
document.write("<br>")
document.write("string <br>")
document.write(variable + "<br>")
```

For Loop #1

- 4. Write the JavaScript code that will use a For Loop that will iterate backwards from 10 to 1. Output the following one per line.
 - a. Use document.write() to display the countdown values to the HTML document.
 - b. Use another document.write() statement to print "BlastOff!" after the loop has completed.

For Loop #2

- 5. Write the JavaScript code that will use a For Loop that will iterate from 1 to 5. Output the following one per line.
- 6. For each iteration, check if the current number is odd or even, and display a message using document.write().

For example:

number is odd

number is even

For Loop #3

- 7. Write a JavaScript program which iterates the integers from 1 to 25. Output the following one per line.
 - a. For multiples of three print "Tres" instead of the number.
 - b. For multiples of five print "Cinco" instead of the number.
 - c. For numbers of both multiples of three and five, print "TresCinco".
