

The mission of Guam Community College is to be a leader in career and technical workforce development by providing the highest quality education and job training in Micronesia.


#### Largest civilian renewable energy producer!

GCC is the Guam Power Authority's largest civilian producer of renewable energy, thanks to the photovoltaics (solar panels) installed on our AALG Allied Health Center and the new Learning Resource Center. Other photovoltaic projects at the college include the LRC parking lot, the Northeast parking lot, the upcoming Student Center and the renovated Foundation Building, and various other photovoltaic-powered parking and streetlights around campus. Michael Makio, vice president and principal architect of Taniguchi Ruth Makio Architects, and the designer of both Allied Health and the LRC, says that with all of the photovoltaic projects in place, GCC's estimated monthly energy savings will be approximately \$ 2,570 per month, with an annual savings of nearly \$31,000. "We are grateful to the Department of the Interior for awarding us the grants to fund these renewable projects," said Dr. Mary Okada. "These new buildings benefit our students not only by providing a wonderful study environment, but also, the energy savings


#### FROM THE PRESIDENT...






## PROJECT AIM SUMMER SUCCESS

Summer Success prepared 19 recent high school graduates from Guam's public high schools for postsecondary education. The students took refresher English and math classes daily, and attended workshops on various study skills, technology skills, and life skills. They earned certificates of completion and then took the GCC Placement Exam on June 23rd.

## College Access Summer Bridge Program

The College Access Challenge Grant Program's free Summer Bridge Program for middle and high school students filled two sessions with 60 students each. They took Math, English, Computer Ed, Science, Social Studies, College Preparation and Chamorro Language classes, attended career-oriented field trips, and had guest presenters tell them about real-world work experiences.



#### CITI PSEAI

The Post-Secondary Education Accessibility Initiative was funded by Citi Foundation and enabled 20 high school graduates or incoming high school seniors to take a six-week college preparation course that included English and math, financial aid counseling, college coping skills workshops, and managing money workshops conducted by Citi employee volunteers. High school graduates could even earn college credits toward a postsecondary program that they intend to pursue.




