Subject: Updates on Committees under VPAA oversight

Date: September 5, 2017

To meet accreditation standards addressing participatory governance by faculty, various committees will be established by the Vice President for Academic Affairs/ Accreditation Liaison Officer (VPAA/ALO) to meet institutional needs that impact student learning. Membership in these committees will be voluntary and in response to the call for participation prior to the start of a new academic year. Services provided will be in accordance with Human Resources (HR) procedures. These committees will not be part of the regular faculty workload. (page 25)

In keeping with the new verbiage in Article VII, Participatory Governance, of the BOT-Faculty Union Local 6476 Agreement, 2017-2023, stated above, this memo provides the following updates on committees under the VPAA oversight for AY 2017-2018:

- 1. To date, I have met with all faculty Chairs and members who have expressed interest to join these committees on a voluntary basis; they each submitted a Committee Interest Form. They have also received appointment letters and returned a signed copy to the VPAA office.
- 2. These committees include the Committee on College Assessment (CCA), Curriculum Review Committee (CRC), Faculty Senate, Resources, Planning and Facilities (RPF) Committee, and Standards Committees 1, 2, 3 and 4.
- 3. Beginning Fall 2017, all these committees shall adopt the open meeting policy. Anyone interested is encouraged to participate in these meetings, in keeping with the participatory governance process on campus.
- 4. Appointment for the College Governing Council (CGC) was made by the President.

- 5. To discuss transition issues, I met with current (this year) and representatives of previous committees (from last year) so everyone is informed about new procedures and processes governing the operations of these committees.
- 6. There are substantive changes to the curriculum approval process, in keeping with Curriculum Manual changes, and in alignment with proposed changes in ACCJC standards. Essentially, these upcoming ACCJC changes shift responsibility from individual faculty to the level of the institution when it comes to improvements emerging out of discussions about assessment in general and SLOs, in particular.
- 7. In alignment with these upcoming ACCJC changes, examples of changes in the streamlined curriculum template include the removal of references to lab fees, personnel qualifications, class size, financial impact, and other requirements that are institutionally-decided by nature.
- 8. In order to speed up the process, there will be NO DEADLINES for the submission of curriculum documents throughout the semester. All submissions will be accepted by CRC till the week before the last day of classes for the semester. There will however be a published priority of curriculum documents that needs immediate attention, with the assistance of CCA. A closer collaboration between CRC and CCA in curriculum work will also be implemented.
- 9. The new curriculum template will be fillable and can only be submitted online. Curriculum documents may be submitted to CRC beginning **Monday, September 11, 2017**.
- 10. Beginning this academic year, the Faculty Senate President joins the regularly-scheduled meetings of the Academic Affairs Division (AAD) and reports on issues or concerns involving faculty under the Faculty Focus agenda. He will also develop a Faculty Senate strategic plan based on discussion points generated from previous committee year-end reports from the last three (3) years, as well as department strategic plans and other data sources, as appropriate.
- 11. Per the new Agreement, I have also sent the names of administrators who will join the Calendar Committee and Resources, Planning and Facilities (RPF) Committee (under the Local 6476 oversight) for AY 2017-2018 to the Union President.
