This program increases learners' basic knowledge and provides assistance in meeting life goals such as securing better employment, obtaining citizenship or a driver's license, acquiring a secondary credential, or participating more in civic and community activities.

Academic Advising

Individuals wanting to enroll in GCC's Adult Basic Education program must be 16 years of age and not enrolled or required to be enrolled in secondary school under Guam Law; and is:

- · basic skills deficient;
- does not have a secondary school diploma or its recognized equivalent, and has not achieved an
 equivalent level of education; or
- an English language learner who has limited ability in reading, writing, speaking, or comprehending the English language and whose native language is a language other than English or lives in a family or community environment where a language other than English is the dominant language.

Upon successful completion of this program, students will be able to:

· perform basic mathematics operations;

- read simple descriptions and narratives; and,
- transition into the Adult High School Diploma or $\operatorname{GED}^{\mathbb{R}}$ program.
