b. On Thursday, February 6, 2020 in E-Building, the divider on the floor to the right of the main entrance is beginning to peel, presenting a safety hazard for students.

The concern has been reported to the Environmental Health & Safety Office.

- c. On Thursday, February 6, 2020 after a 2:00pm class in C23, a student noticed the air conditioner leaking in the back creating a huge puddle near cords/wires.
  - A work order has been submitted. Students are encouraged to let their instructor or any other GCC employee know of these types of concerns, so that they can be resolved as soon as possible.
- d. A student asked if classrooms get cleaned, or if the cleaners only clean the hallways. In particular, the Veteran's Lounge has not been cleaned and their trash has not been taken, even when left outside.

It was explained that the cleaner's clean the bathrooms and hallways and take out the trash several times throughout the day. As for the classrooms, they're supposed to clean the classrooms twice a month. Student lounges are cleaned every day. The students can also schedule cleaning for the Veteran's Lounge through CSI or SSS.


