SPRING COLLEGE ASSEMBLY

This year's Spring College Assembly marked the beginning of GCC's reaccreditation preparation. We are up for accreditation review with the Accrediting Commission for Community & Junior Colleges (ACCJC) in 2025, but there is still some work to do before then. During the College Assembly, all employees, faculty, staff and administrators participated in the review of the standards and provided feedback on further strengthening the College's commitment to our students and community by way of the new ACCJC standards.

The accreditation process is a GCC community effort - stakeholders were given the opportunity to engage in dialogue regarding accreditation standards. We are one of the few colleges whose accreditation review will be based on the new 2024 accreditation standards, which means GCC will qualify for an 8-year accreditation cycle.

During the College Assembly, participants were randomly assigned group numbers for the accreditation breakout sessions. Each group was tasked to an accreditation standard. The information gathered in these sessions was shared and discussed as a whole and will be used when preparing GCC's accreditation report for submission to ACCJC.

The second half of the College Assembly included a detailed presentation on the 2020-2026 Institutional Strategic Master Plan, or ISMP. Francisco "Kiko" Palacios, GCC Sustainability & Project Coordinator discussed the Institution's progress in carrying out ISMP related activities from prior years and the result from these findings. Afterwards, breakout sessions were created to gather input and ideas on how GCC departments or programs can better prepare their ISMP assessment activities for the upcoming cycle.

ALUMNA GIVES BACK TO COMMUNITY

Ageline Sahagun Salas, a GCC Alumna in Medical Assisting and soon-to-be medical doctor was on Guam the weekend of April 15, 2023 to host her free "Teddy Bear Island Clinic" at the Micronesia Mall Center Court.

The event was a community program geared towards reducing children's fear and anxiety around medical personnel, procedures, and vaccinations. Through fun, interactive play with a free teddy bear, the program aimed to promote healthy behaviors while simultaneously inspiring Pacific Islander youths to seek out medicine or allied health as potential careers.

Children lined up at the center court to play the role of the doctor and their teddy bears as their patients. Children role-played medical tasks with guidance from students from the Guam Community College and the University of Guam studying to be health professionals. Teddy bears went through several different stations such as vitals check, medical laboratory with real microscopes, immunizations, and even a mock x-ray machine.

GCC is always happy to hear about these great success stories and even happier to be a part of them.
