

DNA BUILDING RIBBON CUTTING

Joined by the Department of Interior Assistant Secretary for Insular and International Affairs, Carmen G. Cantor, Guam Community College cut the ribbon opening the **Gregorio G. Perez Crime Lab Building Annex** on Wednesday, January 25, 2023.

The opening of the crime lab will assist law enforcement personnel, on Guam and in this region, in solving crimes with the latest technology built in the 4,915 square foot laboratory. The building has a Combined DNA Index System (CODIS) room, a case room; and classroom areas for the Criminal Justice program.

Construction of the Gregorio G. Perez Crime Lab Annex project broke ground on October 4, 2019. It is designed to be Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Certified.
