For the first time since the Covid-19 pandemic, the Edge Student Conference was held at the Westin Resort Guam as an in-person event. A total of 147 students participated. The Edge Student Conference was designed and created for registered postsecondary and Adult High School students interested in gaining skills that will help them in the workplace.



The main sessions included Ethics in the Workplace, Meet the Deans, and "Dress for Success" by GCC Cosmetology. WestCare offered Uplift Counseling Services. Participants also attended breakout sessions such as Financing your Future, Job Search & Resume Writing, and How to Ace Your Job Interviews presented by GCC faculty, administrators, and community professionals. Students also had the opportunity to participate in teambuilding activities facilitated by our student leaders.

COSMETOLOGY ASSISTS IN ST. BALDRICK'S



The Cosmetology Program teamed up with local news station, KUAM, in support of the St. Baldrick's Foundation on Saturday, March 18th at the Guam Premiere Outlets in Tamuning. St. Baldrick's Foundation is the organization that allows community members to shave their heads in order to raise much-needed funding for children fighting cancer, as well as their families and caretakers, according to the news organziation.

There were 20 shavees that took a seat to show their support by shaving their head, and 9 people donated their hair to be used as wigs for cancer patients.

This was the first St. Baldrick's event since 2017. The event coincidentally raised \$2,023. The Insurance Association of Guam matched the collection. Over \$4,000 was raised to conquer childhood cancer! There were 23 Cosmetology students and faculty members that volunteered their time and talent to the event. A portion of the monies raised went to a local beneficiary, the Edward M. Calvo Cancer Foundation.

Participants in this bootcamp completed the seven-week curriculum including Childcare Management, Introduction to Exceptional Children, and How to Start a Childcare Business. Other courses included Heartsaver First Aid, CPR, AED, and WorkKeys®.

The Childcare Bootcamp series was funded by the Guam Economic Development Authority (GEDA), and developed by the Department of Public Health and Social Services (DHPSS) and GCC to educate, train, and provide our island families with qualified daycare providers to meet the critical shortage in available and affordable daycare and after-school programs. This program is free to qualified applicants who are accepted into the cohort.


