## **UOG-GCC Program-to-Program Articulation: Criminal Justice Degree Program**

March 2013

This approved Program-to-Program Articulation, between the University of Guam and the Guam Community College, paves the way for GCC students who complete their Associate of Science Degree in Criminal Justice to transfer to the University of Guam having fulfilled their UOG General Education requirements and a number of major courses at GCC and continuing on with Junior class standing to complete major course and baccalaureate requirements for the University's Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice.

### **GCC's Associate of Science Degree Program in Criminal Justice**

**Mission.** According to the AY2012-2013 GCC Catalog, the mission of the Criminal Justice program is to prepare, educate, and train students for the Criminal Justice profession. Criminal Justice graduates will be lifelong learners who possess current technical knowledge of the criminal justice system, communication skills to communicate effectively within the criminal justice system, and an understanding of the interrelations of the criminal justice professional and society.

**Program Description.** This program is designed to address training requirements for students seeking employment as police officers, marshals, conservation officers, Guam Customs officers, investigators, corrections officers, forensic computer examiners, forensic lab technicians, and other public safety employees. Students may choose an emphasis in one of four areas of concentration:

- Administration of Criminal Justice
- Law Enforcement Administration
- Forensic Lab Technician
- Forensic Computer Examiner

Some courses in this program must be sequenced because of prerequisite requirements. Other courses, including Mathematics and English, require placement testing before enrollment is granted. (See a Criminal Justice advisor before enrolling in this program or choosing electives.)

#### **Program Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs):**

Upon successful completion of the AS in Criminal Justice program, students will be able to:

1. Identify the legal procedures for gathering information about crimes, criminal procedure, and defendants' rights.
2. Describe the process of the criminal justice system including the duties and responsibilities of the criminal justice professional as it pertains to one of the chosen concentration areas:

Administration of CJ, Law Enforcement Administration, Forensic Lab Technician, or Forensic Computer Examiner.

3. Demonstrate the ability to understand the interrelations, ethics, and role expectations of the criminal justice professional in society

### **UOG's Bachelor of Science Degree Program in Criminal Justice**

The Criminal Justice Program is designed as an interdisciplinary study drawing from legal studies, mathematics, psychology, business and public administration. Graduates qualify to hold management and administrative positions within the criminal justice system, i.e., corrections, customs, judiciary, police, etc. The program requires sixteen (16) courses with each course completed in the sequence specified by advisors. In order to meet individual needs and interests, students may draw from several courses to complete their required electives.

**Criminal Justice Program Learning Goals:**

Goal 1: Demonstrate a general understanding of the various roles of criminal justice professions in the public and private sectors;

Goal 2: Demonstrate leadership and teamwork skills;

Goal 3: Demonstrate critical thinking and analytical skills in solving real world problems in criminal justice;

Goal 4: Demonstrate a sufficient real world understanding of law and public policy process;

Goal 5: Demonstrate proficiency in information technology, and communication skills, etc.;

Goal 6: Demonstrate an understanding of local, regional and global environments and their relevance to criminal justice;

Goal 7: Demonstrate an understanding of ethical, professional, and socially responsible behavior.
