





- 4) Towel



However, if a child becomes disruptive and the parents do not take them out of the LRC, an employee will approach the responsible adult and advise them that they would have to step outside with their child.
 - Can the Student Lounge hours be extended until 9:30 pm? There are students that are staying back until that time. From the TSS
 Dean: Effective, February 27th, the Student Lounge is now open from Mon-Thurs from 8am-9:30pm, Fridays from 8am-5pm.
 - There are people at the computer lab that are not registered students or they don't have their student ID with them. How can we get more monitoring of the lab so that only students use these computers? From GCC MIS Department: People who are not registered students and students who don't have their IDs are not allowed to be in the Open Labs and anyone who is a witness of this can kindly request of them to vacate or excuse themselves from the area, or else security personnel will be dispatched to the Open Lab location. Anyone can call 735-5555 to alert security or Student Support Services Personnel, and/or the Night Administrator, if these unauthorized individuals refuse to leave. If necessary, calls can also be made directly to the MIS Offices at 735-5619, 735-5511, or 734-0540, and someone can go to the location and assist in removing the person who is not supposed to be there.
 - 4. Who do we look for when there is no employee on duty at the computer lab? If we approach a student asking for their ID, it may cause a conflict. How can we identify who is on duty at the computer lab? From GCC MIS Department: We currently also have one Work Study Student hired and we are looking at hiring more Work Study or S.T.E.P. students as finances or the budget allows. These MIS Work Study or S.T.E.P. students should have been issued or will be issued temporary employee identification indicating they are there as MIS Lab Assistants. The schedules of MIS staff and MIS Work Study Students are currently setup to have as much coverage at the Open Labs, but many times they are called to provide computer support to other areas of the campus and at GCC programs at the high schools.
