- 1. Feedback from concerns brought up at the September 5<sup>th</sup> General Membership meeting
  - a. Firing Range is now fenced in but is noted as a site on the evacuation map the arrows on the map were meant to depict the direction to an evacuation 'assembly area' and not specifically to the firing range shelter.
  - b. Speed humps and speed tables the current speed humps are portable and can be moved & relocated at any time. Speed tables may be considered in future Capital Improvement Projects.
  - c. Allied Health Building water outages Building 3000's water outages were attributed to normal wear & tear on our pumps, unstable power hits on our pumps, & deficient GWA water pressure. The remedies will be the installations of check valves at all of the GCC's water meters & domestic water tanks, and Power-Line Conditioning Systems in Buildings 4000, 3000 & 1000.
  - d. More NO SMOKING signs placed around the campus the Safety Office has a few bigger signs and will put them up. The college will also generate a RFQ (Request for Quotes) to determine if they can purchase more.

- e. Security guards visib and use of student labs the security guard who is seen in the computer lab was a Department of Corrections guard and has since been advised that the computer lab is only for student use.

  Additionally, the college will ensure that our GCC guards are more visible at the parking lot areas at 9:30pm.
- f. Classes changing or being cancelled at the last minute and instructors changing after schedules are posted class cancellations can occur at the request of the Department Chairs for various reasons and students can be dropped from these cancelled classes and for tuition non-payment.

  Instructor changes occur at the request of Department Chairs for a variety of reasons.
- g. Instructors starting class early and ending class early please report any discrepancies or concerns for instructor teaching times to the Student Support Services office in Building B or you can email the GCC Human Resources Office directly at hr@guamcc.edu
- h. Adult High school classes don't all have text books and had to be given copies there was a shortage of textbooks because students did not return their textbooks from the previous semester. As of this semester, the faculty will be responsible for distributing and collecting them at the end of the course.
- i. Reinstating late registration to help those who need classes to graduate Late Registration has been eliminated.

  However, exceptions have been made on a case-by-case basis. There will be formal changes soon that will allow for student schedule changes after the first day of classes.
- j. Graduation evals for students taking classes during the summer allowing students to "walk" who haven't completed all their requirements is a courtesy allowed on a case-by-case basis and may be discontinued.
- k. Difference between GCC Wireless and GCC WiFi; longer time limit for the 'WiFi' GCC Wireless is a different system that allows for wireless Internet access at limited locations without authentication and is not part of the original GCC Campus-wide WiFi installation. Plans are now in the works for GCC Wireless to be removed so that only GCC WiFi will be available and with authentication. GCC WiFi use duration limit has been changed from 10 minutes to 3 hours and will then prompt for re-authentication as needed.
- 1. Uncomfortable wooden chairs at the LRC computer lab the college will look into a funding source with specific comfortability in mind. Please be mindful that the LRC is a Gold LEED certified building and all furniture in the LRC must meet LEED requirements which are more costly.




