In fall 2015, the College launched a Marine & Terrestrial Conservation Enforcement concentration, which is part of the of Criminal Justice program was launched. The program partners GCC with the Department of Agriculture's Fish & Wildlife Division, with the Guam Police Department, and with the Judiciary of Guam's Special Enforcement Tactics division. The 24 cadets who were enrolled in the 13th Criminal Justice Academy were the first to undergo classroom instruction hours for boat safety. The creation of these specialty courses was a response to the CJ Advisory Board's request to bolster conservation efforts on the island
